Wind Farm at Sunderland Farm

The East Riding refused planning consent but developers RES (Renewable Energy Systems) appealed and were successful. The wind farm will now be built.

RES has provided a fund for the benefit of the parish. A panel to decide how to spend the money will include three Roos parish councillors, one East Riding ward councillor, one RES member and two parish volunteers.

Cookery Corner by Ann Coupe

Pumpkin and Mincemeat Pie

Ideal for Halloween Night

Serves 6-8

Ingredients

410g/ 14oz cooked pumpkin

100g/ 4oz soft light brown sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

½ teaspoon ginger

½ teaspoon salt

2 size 3 eggs (lightly beaten)

150ml/ ¼ pint milk

4 tablespoons sweet mincemeat

23cm/ 9 inch dia. unbaked shortcrust
pastry case

Whipped cream for decoration

Method

1. In a large mixing bowl, combine the pumpkin, sugar, spices, salt, eggs and milk. Mix well.
2. Spread the mincemeat evenly over the bottom of the pastry case. Pour the pumpkin mixture on top.
3. Bake gas mark 7, 220°C/425°F, Fan 200°C for 15 minutes; reduce heat to gas mark 4, 180°C/350°F, Fan 160°C and continue cooking for 35-40 minutes or until a knife inserted 2.5cm/1inch from the edge comes out clean. Cool thoroughly.
4. Serve decorated with whipped cream.

ROOS BELLS

We are in the process of seeking 'official' advice from the York Diocese Advisory Council regarding our proposed project to refurbish the bells at Roos Church. We are hoping to include the addition of a 6th bell in the scheme. The two firms of bell engineers who have inspected and quoted for the work have come up with different plans for the additional frame needed for the new bell.

The existing ring of five was installed in 1911 and so it would be good if they could be rehung in 2011.



Until we have finalised the details of the exact nature of the work involved it is not possible to come up with a bottom-line figure but the total is likely to be £45 - £50,000 (including the new bell). Some of this will be met by grants from Ringing Associations and we shall be applying to other grant-awarding bodies. Donations using Gift Aid will further reduce the cost to us, as will the use of local labour to assist the bell engineers.

The new bell will weigh approx 4 cwt and will cost approximately £20,000 to buy and install. If anyone feels they would like to make a sizeable donation towards paying for it, there is the opportunity to have it inscribed. Many new bells in other towers are donated in memory of a loved one.

We feel it is important to keep the bells ringing in our Church. The refurbishment work is essential in order to do this. The extra bell will attract more ringers. Change ringing on 5 is very limiting and puts people off from coming to our tower.

In the past year we have taught some new ringers. Gill Dickinson recently rang her first quarter peal and is to be congratulated on this achievement.

Alec's Patch ... By Alec Dodson

If you have a pond now is the time to cover it with netting to prevent leaves falling in. A clean-up and cutting-down of plants in the pond will make this task easier.

Lawns have grown more in recent weeks than during the summer, so be prepared to continue mowing. Remove fallen leaves and compost them. Raise the height of cut on your mower to make mowing easier.

Cut down herbaceous plants but leave any which will be ornamental with flower heads during the autumn/winter.

October is the best time to plant bulbs, shrubs and trees. Move frost-sensitive plants indoors.

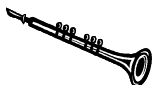

Roos Parish Council Meeting 11th October 2010

Eight Councillors were present

Apologies from Councillor J Cracknell

The September minutes were approved. Summary below.

Meeting with RES UK Ltd

The Chairman welcomed representatives of the above company together with EYRC ward Cllrs Parsons and Stead and Karen Wood of ERYC to the meeting to discuss the way forward now that the Planning Inspectorate had granted planning permission for the wind farm development at land west of Ivy House, Rectory Road, Roos.

Following an earlier meeting in the day at County Hall it had been suggested that a panel of seven comprising 3 Parish Council representatives 1 each from RES UK and ERYC and 2 local members of the public be formed to consider applications for funding of proposed projects from a fund provided by the developers of the wind farm

It was agreed to adopt the seven-member panel and to seek applications from members of the public to serve in a voluntary capacity on the panel by way of notices in "The Rooster" and the notice boards.

It was agreed that the Council meet again with the company at 7pm at the December meeting to discuss future progress and any further developments in the matter.

Proposed allotments in the parish

The Clerk reported that he had now obtained location maps from ERYC showing the parcel of land which may be suitable for which ownership had not been established and that an approach to the Land Registry would be made to confirm ownership details.

Car parking on Main Street near the school

A reply was received from the retiring Headteacher of the school and it was agreed to seek a site meeting of interested parties with ERYC to discuss the ongoing problems of traffic congestion caused by vehicles parking outside the school.

Parish path Issue

The Clerk reported that he had been in contact with Cllr Willie of Burton Pidsea Parish Council who had confirmed that it had been agreed to support any application for the reinstatement of the parish path leading towards and linking up with Burton Pidsea footpath no.8.

Speeding vehicles in Main Street

The Chairman reported that ERYC was monitoring the situation and that speed tests were to be carried out on vehicles using the road.

Flooding and related matters

It was reported that a meeting was to be held with Mr Beal to review the piped

section of the beck through his land in Dove Lane to determine whether there were any defects in the system and Cllr Ward again confirmed that he together with Mr Wray would attempt to remove the tree trunk adjoining Mr Wray's property in the near future.

It was reported that ERYC was awaiting a decision from the Church authorities on making land available for drainage improvements off Rectory Road and that all other landowners approached had agreed in principle to making land available for the proposed improvement schemes.

Correspondence

ERYC parish news

The latest edition of the above newsletter was distributed for members' individual consideration.

Proposed road safety scheme – B1242 east of Roos

The Clerk circulated a plan received from ERYC showing proposed road safety measures which basically showed the proposed installation of "cats eyes" on the highway which the Council welcomed on this stretch of road.

Highway matters

The Clerk reported receipt of a reply from The Area Engineer of ERYC which stated that he had looked at the junction of Quaker Road with the B1242 and that there were already advance junction warning signs and slow markings in place together with direction signs and unfortunately not much else could be done at the location.

He also stated that the no-through-road sign situated on South End Road is plainly visible from Beckside Manor and as such could not justify relocating it.

Police report

A report was received from the Police highlighting theft of YEDL electrical cable from a field opposite Hilston Road and two instances of anti-social behaviour in the form of neighbour disputes.

Planning

Applications

Variation of condition 2 of application 357-10004 at Church Farm Riding School, Tower Road, Hilston

It was agreed that no objections be made to the above proposal.

Construction of earth embankment to existing coastal defences to create new flood defence, creation of intertidal habitat and associated works at land south of Sand Le Mere Caravan Park

It was agreed that no objections be made to the above proposal.

Decision

Erection of single-storey extension at rear at The Old School Cottage, Pilmar Lane

It was reported that ERYC had approved the above application.

Parish plan

There were no outstanding issues raised in connection with the plan.

Treasurer's report

The Treasurer sought and received approval for payment of the following account:-

R Dry – annual maintenance of Tunstall village green - £70.00

Any other business

Footpath – Main Street

It was reported that grass was growing through the recently resurfaced path and it was agreed to refer the matter to ERYC.

Public session

A member of the public queried the proposed seven-member panel in relation to the RES wind farm development suggesting that consideration should have been given to appointing more members of the general public to the panel and it was also confirmed that Neil Ager of ERYC was attending a site meeting with a resident to discuss a proposal to build a wall alongside the beck adjacent to his property.

Councillor vacancy

The Council considered three applications received for the casual vacancy and it was agreed to co-opt Keith Tyson onto the Council and that he be invited to attend the next Council meeting.
