Your Community Team at Withernsea Police Station

Humberside Police has undergone a recent restructure which will see an increase in officers based at Withernsea. A number of permanent officers will be covering Holderness and will respond to calls for service. Pc Will Stephenson and myself, Pc Matt Ainley will be community officers working alongside our dedicated PCSOs. We will be committed to, being in our communities, available when our communities need us, communicating and listening to community's needs. Working together with the public and other partners to identify and resolve local issues including ASB and Criminal Damage. Our community team publish monthly updates to all parish / town councils and provide information on local priorities on the Humberside Police website. Email the team at Withernsea@Humberside.pnn.police.uk As we are now well into the New Year I would like to remind you of a free web site called immobilize.com. This site allows you to register your possessions including bikes, mobile phone, tablets etc. Should they be lost or stolen the site is updated and all Police forces have access to search items we come across. An example would be you lose your mobile phone, Immobilize has your IMEI number and it's updated as lost. Should the police come across a mobile, either with a suspect or handed in. A simple check will tell us who the owner is and we can return it. Any member of the team can help you register.

Roos Parish Council Report: February 2016 *Parish Council Minutes are published in full on Parish Notice Boards and on the parish website – roosparish.info The following is a 'snapshot' of some of the issues considered.*

Local Community Transport – Survey

Thanks were expressed to those households who had completed and returned their questionnaire. Approximately 500 had been distributed and 58 returned. These have now been delivered to the ERYC for analysis. In the meantime a 'pilot' bus service CB3 - The Hedon Shuttle, has been launched. The service operates on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, a printed timetable is published locally and may be accessed on roosparish.info

Speeding Vehicles

The ERYC continue to evaluate this on-going issue. A recent survey has determined that the level of traffic on Main Street does not meet the required criteria for the appointment of a 'school lollipop' traffic control officer.

Correspondence

It was confirmed that the Local Community Police Officer would attend the March meeting at 7pm to provide an update on local policing matters.

ERYC Planning

Decisions. The following were reported as having been approved by the ERYC:-

15/03241/PLF - Town Farm, Main Street, Tunstall - approved subject to ERYC conditions.

15/01772/PLF DONG Energy installation of a dual Doppler weather radar station - approved subject to ERYC conditions.

DC/15/03913/PLF - 8 South Park Roos. Erection of single storey extension.

DC/15/03822/PLF - 25 Elm Garth, Roos. Alterations and extensions.

Tunstall Coastal Defence Scheme

It was reported that a Compulsory Purchase Order was now being sought in order to secure delivery of the project. ERYC Local Development Plan - Strategy Document. The Planning Inspectors Report is now published and subject to a number of modifications being made, is approved, providing an appropriate basis for future planning across the East Riding. The Allocations Document, which will give more detail concerning the location for future development will be published in the next two/three months. The Inspectors Report may viewed on-line at:

It was noted that several residents within Roos have been unable to have broadband provision installed to their properties. The matter has been taken up with BT by the ERYC. It is understood that additional capacity will be installed in the near future.

Councillor vacancy

Following due electoral procedures it was reported that Mr Martin Devanney of Pilmar Lane, Roos, had been elected to the Council and will attend the March meeting.

Any other business.

Wind Farm Community Benefit Funds. It was noted that the Roos Wind Farm Community Fund is now open. The Tedder Hill Wind Farm Fund will soon follow. It was agreed the Council should consider initiating and developing applications for projects of wider community benefit.
