## All Saints' Pipe Organ



The historic pipe organ at All Saints' Roos, which has been unplayable, since the late 1980s is to be restored to its original condition later this year. It was built in 1881 by K.C. Reiter of Hull and is one of only two by this maker to have survived in an unmodified state. This makes it an important instrument and worthy of restoration.

In July it will be dismantled and taken to Harrogate for restoration. It is hoped to have it back in situ by Christmas. In the meantime the organ chamber will be fully renovated



which will include major repairs to the window on the south side of the church.

This £73,000 project is being made possible by 'The Friends of Roos Organ Fund', various grant awards, donations and fund raising. The recent award of £44,200 from 'The Heritage Lottery Fund' is tremendous news and means the long overdue restoration can finally go ahead.

# Parish Council *Comment*

*Looking back through past editions of the Rooster and Council minutes, it is interesting to see what 'water has passed under the bridge since April 2014.*

## **Hunters Bridge:**

The bridge linking the parish of Roos and Burton Pidsea has been completed and is now open for walkers.

## **Tunstall Coastal Defence Scheme:**

This proposed barrier is designed to prevent the sea breaching coastal defences and flooding parts of Holderness. This project was introduced by the Environment Agency in 2010 and finance was set aside. Later, responsibility passed to the ERYC who assured the Parish Council that a start of construction was imminent. The latest news is that all parties are close to agreement and that work is scheduled to start this year!



## **Roos Beck:**

Following the floods of 2007, much remedial work has been completed throughout the village to improve drainage systems and its water flow. This includes the installation of an electronic early warning water level system. However, late last year rain water began to collect in South End Road. Yorkshire Water and the ERYC undertook a camera survey; this showed some dropped bricks and

silting, later removed by pressure jetting. Yorkshire Water has confirmed that the system is now performing correctly. Some readers may wish to seek a copy of the correspondence for home insurance purposes from the Parish Clerk.

## **Allotments:**

The Council has been trying to secure suitable land for allotment provision without any success. Several potential sites have been identified but discussions with landowners have proved unsuccessful. It is perhaps timely for residents to reaffirm their interest in such provision. Please contact either the Parish Clerk or the editor of The Rooster. Finally for this month –

## **Dog Fouling:**

Judging by the number of times this is raised at Council meetings it continues to be a matter of real concern for many residents and is an offence! As the ERYC website states

*"The great majority of dog walkers do pick up after their dog and get really annoyed with the few who don't as they don't want to be 'tarred with the same brush.' There is no excuse for not picking up".*

In a relatively small community such as Roos, it is inevitable that dog owners – offenders – have been noticed as not picking up after their dogs. It is only a matter of time before they are reported to the ERYC.

## Roos Pharmacy



We are pleased to confirm Dr Lloyd has now joined us as a salaried GP – he has now completed his GP training. In addition we have welcomed new

recruits in our reception team and have a new Healthcare Assistant. You are likely to meet our new recruits as they will all work at Roos occasionally.

We are now offering a “managed repeat” service to dispensing patients who order medication monthly. This will mean your medication will automatically be ordered for you to save you the time. The dispenser will tell you when your next script will be available for collection. This has been changed to help us provide you with a more efficient service.

Please be aware that the dispensary opening times are different to the times we are available to answer telephone calls. This is to allow dispensers to make up medication uninterrupted to reduce the risk of any mistakes.

We soon hope to increase appointments at our Roos surgery and we also plan to open our dispensary on Tuesdays for collection of medication only. This will especially help the rush after Bank Holidays when we are currently shut from Friday evening until the following Wednesday.

## Defibrillator in Roos

Did you know that Roos has its own Defibrillator located outside Roos school.

An access code will be given by the ambulance service over the telephone if its use is required.
