Make a Pom Pom. Make a Difference



THE ALL SAINTS CATERPILLAR NEEDS YOUR HELP

We are hoping as many people as possible will help to make an exceedingly long pom pom caterpillar, initially to be as long as All Saints Church, but maybe to wrap around it? Jill Evison has had the idea to raise funds towards the installation of toilet facilities in the church and would like the whole community to get involved. Make a pom pom, donate £1 and your pom pom will be attached by Jill to the caterpillar. The round cardboard circles need to be 8cm in diameter – (draw around the top of a standard pint glass) and the inner circle is the size of a 2p coin. Any colour wool is fine. Alternatively you could buy a pom pom kit for £2. This includes instructions, the cardboard templates, some wool, and is inclusive of your donation. CB3 BUS Service



We have analysed the usage of the CB3 over the Pilot Period of one year and have decided to revise the service it offers to Burton Pidsea and Roos. Whereas the Wednesday and Friday morning busses are well supported, neither of the afternoon busses are. Our decision is therefore to cancel both afternoon busses as we cannot justify the cost of continuing to run them, we will invest the savings made in lengthening the period of time over which current funding will support the service. It will take several weeks to get these changes approved so things will probably remain as they are until the beginning of June, the driver of the CB3 Derek will keep you informed, new timetables will be produced and announcements made in the news letter and notice boards. Please continue to use both the Wednesday and Friday busses to support and justify our work in raising sponsorship for the future running of the CB3 service. Burton Pidsea Better Transport Group

Woodland Group Roos



This autumn will you have apples to spare? We'd like to collect them from you!

This autumn, we will gather apples from our own trees, and from anyone else in the village that has apples to spare. Last time we did this, over 2 tons of apples were gathered and pressed into 'Roos Juice', which was sold to raise money for our tree planting escapades. The apple juice is produced on a non-profit basis, as all time is donated and all profits go directly to tree planting and care.

If you would like to join our fruit pickers in October and November, then please let me know on the email below. Anyone donating apples will receive 15% back in the form of pasteurized juice – the remainder will be turned into juice and cider and anyone helping us to pick will get a share of the juice produced.

We have plans for many more trees and hedges in years to come, and our orchard trees are going to play a big part in this. Walking north of the village towards Hilston, you will notice the group's orchard trees are full of blossom – a promising sign of a harvest to come.

You will notice that all of the trees now have printed labels giving the tree's variety, eating quality and when they will be ready to pick. Also, the Roos Parish Council's website carries a section in which you will find pictures of all the trees with even more information.

Emergency Plan

Councillors approved the up-dated plan. Copies will now be distributed as appropriate and replace those in the Emergency Boxes.

Correspondence

Tedder Hill Wind Farm Tree Planting Fund

Confirmation was received from ERYC (HEYwoods) of the launch of the tree planting fund arising from the Tedder Hill Wind Farm development. The area of benefit is within the vicinity of the development.

It was agreed that Cllr. Dodson would represent the Council on the panel to be established to evaluate applications. It was confirmed that Roos Woodland Group has been informed about this funding opportunity.

Traffic and Highways:

- It was noted that further speed camera surveys had been conducted on the B1242 – Pilmar Lane, the details of several drivers exceeding the speed limit were recorded. Those exceeding 35mph will receive a cautionary letter.
- Maintenance of the roadway south towards Dents Garth.
A letter from the ERYC noted that "the Council (ERYC) is under no obligation to maintain the route to support any private vehicular use nor upgrade the route to an adoptable standard. Any improvement to support vehicular use would be done at private expense and would require the agreement of the highway authority to ensure public usage was not prohibited"

Councillor Vacancy

The Clerk reported that the ERYC had confirmed that the vacancy could now be filled by co-option. It was agreed to advertise and invite applications, which would thereby be considered by the council

Planning

The Council considered and recommended approval of the following:

- Fell sycamore tree as leaning over footpath and roots damaging wall at All Saint's Church, Rectory Road. Roos – Application ref: 17/00711/TC
- Change of use from dwelling to beauty salon business at 1 Main Street, Roos – Application Ref: 17/00688/PLF
- ERYC Decision – Fell sweet chestnut tree as bark reduced at ground level and with concerns of failure over road, also, fell 2 ash trees as large amount of dead growth in crown at Ivy House, Rectory Road, Roos. Approved.

Any other business

Tedder Hill Wind Farm Fund

Cllr. Ainley, reported that because of administration difficulties within the ERYC, the launch of the fund would be delayed.
