The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is holding 2 meetings on Tuesday 27th March in the Roos Institute. The first is the Parish Meeting at 6.30pm and is open to everyone who lives within the Parish of All Saints' Roos and the purpose of the meeting is to elect the Churchwardens. The second is the Annual Meeting, which is again an open meeting and follows on quite quickly. This meeting is the forum for the wider congregation and users of the church at large to find out from the PCC officers and the Vicar what's happened during the last year and hear what is being planned for the coming year of 2018. There will also be the re-election and appointment of new members of the PCC and other officers.

Anyone interested in attending will be made very welcome, especially as, at the moment, All Saints' Church is looking for people who are willing to become Churchwardens as well as for new members for the Parochial Church Council (PCC) to take us forward into 2018 and beyond.

In order to undertake the role of Churchwarden, they must be members of the Church of England and be eligible to be included on the Electoral Roll of All Saints' Church. Support and training for the role of Churchwarden is available.

PCC members must also be eligible to be included on the Electoral Roll for the parish. The PCC are responsible for the administering of the life and business of the church family and property. However, someone who is not on the Electoral Roll can be co-opted onto the PCC but, according to church law, they do not have the voting rights of an ordinary member of the PCC.

The Annual Parish Meeting ends with the usual Roos first class refreshments, following which the new PCC and its officers continue to meet and hold their first official meeting

Roos Parish Council Report: January 2018

Parish Council Minutes are published in full on Parish Notice Boards and on the parish website – roosparish.info. The following is a condensed version of the recently confirmed Minutes for January 2018

Tunstall Drain re-alignment scheme

Following ERYC's presentation it was agreed to ask that once the scheme was underway that the new control penstock valve at Thirtle Bridge be installed as quickly as possible.

Planning

- Variation of Condition 11 (approved plans of permission 11/05696/STPLF (change of use of land to
 form an extension to existing caravan park) to increase the number of static caravans from 19 to 26 and
 provide a circular access road instead of the previously approved cul-de-sacs at Holderness Country
 Park, Southfield Lane, Tunstall. It was agreed that no objections be made to the application, but to seek
 clarity from ERYC as to whether the units were for holiday purposes or permanent residential
 occupation.
- Continued use of Dual Doppler radar system in relation to monitoring wind speed and complex wind flow patterns for the existing Westermost Rough offshore wind farm at Pastures Lane Tunstall. It was reported that ERYC had refused the above application.

Treasurer's report The Treasurer sought and received approval for payment of the following accounts:-

- Avondale Landscapes work on paths 1,2,4,8,10,16,17 and 18 £305.00
- B Lee salary/expenses for three months £925.00
- Memorial Institute hire of hall £50.00
- The financial statement had previously been circulated to members and it was agreed that the precept requirement for 2018/19 be £4,000.00. The Chair and Clerk signed the demand form for forwarding to ERYC.

Any other business

Parking at bus stops. Cllr Devanney reported that vehicles were parking at the newly designated bus stops. It was reported that ERYC would be installing appropriate road markings, following which the owner of any vehicle being parked in these areas would be issued with a fixed penalty notice.

Annual review of Clerk's salary/expenses. It was agreed that the Clerk's salary/expenses be increased by £150.00 per annum with effect from 1st January 2018.
