ROOS WOODLAND GROUP UPDATE

Can you believe it is 10 years since the Roos Woodland Group was established? Thanks to numerous grants from the Roos Windfarm Community Benefit Fund, fund raising events and many gratefully received donations the Group has gone from strength to strength. If you look at the hedgerows and new trees as you go towards Halsham out of Roos; walk down Hilston Road past the Maltas Row Community Fruit trees; see the improvements made around All Saints' Church and Footpath Five at the back of Beechwood Views or admire the many new bulb plantings you will see how our work has improved the environment for both the community and for wildlife.

We are currently considering how to mark our 10th Anniversary and also how the Group can commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. One recent activity has been the establishment of a new wood,

funded by the Woodland Trust, and planted near Roos Carrs in sight of All Saints' Church. If members of the parish have any ideas or a suitable planting place for trees, shrubs or bulbs do get in contact with us.

Below are the main events.

• Lighting of the Beacons – Thursday 2nd June

• Jubilee Beer Festival – Saturday 4th June

Our Area Dean Rev. Alisdair Laird (based at Patrington) is looking after us in the meantime and can be contacted on 01964 630327.

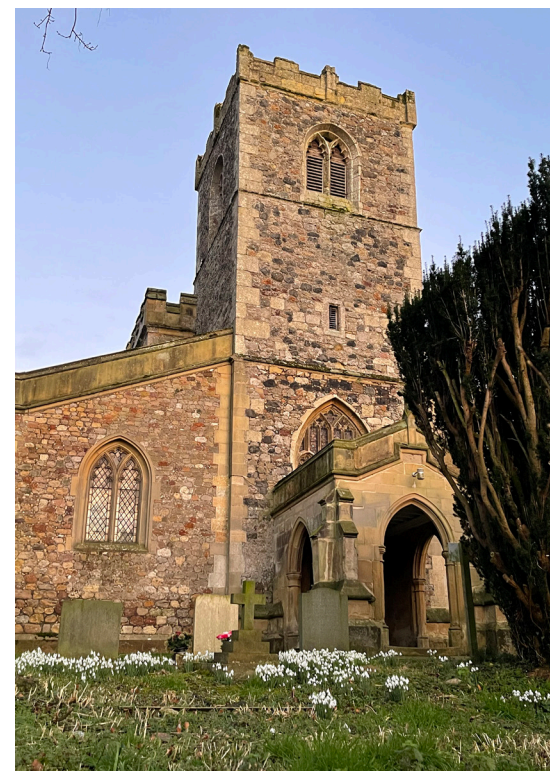
Sunday services are still taking place each week at 9.30am and are generally as follows

We're watching out for you... please pick up and dispose responsibly.



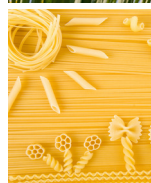
ROOS RUBBISH RESCUERS (RRR)

RRR is about cleaning up the environment and highlighting litter problems, particularly in the Roos, Hilston, Owstwick and Tunstall areas.

The group is free for anyone to join and is independent of the Parish Council who are, however, fully supportive. The Parish Council loan the group litter pickers and black bags and organise disposal of the bags.

The Group was set up by Caroline Hare a couple of months ago and 28 bags of grot have already been collected.
