ROOS JUICE COMING SOON

Members of the Roos Woodland Group (RWG) were out in force during October picking apples to make their popular Roos Juice.

Apples were collected from their

own trees planted 10 years ago as well as many donated by villagers in Roos, Tunstall and Halsham. Varieties have such wonderful names as Dog Snout, Hornsea Herring, Dr Kidd's Orange Red,

St Edmund's Pippin, Katy, Fiesta and of course the famous Bramley.

The apples are processed, pasteurised and bottled by Side Oven Bakery at Foston on the Wolds, near Driffield.

Madge Moore, Chair of the Roos Woodland Group said: "It's been a bumper year for apples and it's great that our own trees are now contributing to the juice. However we couldn't make this great product without numerous generous donations and our great band of

volunteers who go out and pick the apples".

The RWG were also helped by volunteers from the Tweendykes Sixth Form as part of their Duke of Edinburgh Award. The children also took away apples to sell as part of their enterprise activity.

REMEMBER, REMEMBER THE 5TH OF NOVEMBER

We all worry about our pets during firework time, but have you thought about wild animals?

For hedgehogs an unlit bonfire is a five star hotel with an unlimited buffet, a hedgehog will enter a bonfire to sleep. Their natural reaction to danger is to curl up so risk being burnt alive or getting badly burnt. If you are going to have a gathering with a fire consider other options - an off ground fire pit, a fire bin or only build the fire the day you are lighting it, any fires that have been around for a few days then check them before lighting

Have you considered helping more with hedgehogs?

Become a volunteer with Holderness Hedgehog Hospital, there are several roles that you could help with. Do you have space in your shed or garage for a cage to become a foster carer - full training to be given. Emergency drivers are needed to collect hedgehogs that require care and taking to an assessor or vet.

Fund raising, as a charity we rely on donations, visit our Christmas Fair - details in the events diary, back page. Could you have a hog house in your garden? Could you put food and water out each night to support

hedgehogs that are released after receiving treatment? Leave an area of your garden wild, hedgehogs use leaves etc to build their nest. Have a hole in your fence/ gate to allow them to travel between gardens - they

cover large areas in their search for food and mates. Hedgehogs can swim but struggle to climb out of ponds, ensure you have a ramp or stone stairway they can use, cover open drains.

Shown in the photo are three siblings which were rescued as tiny babies, they were cared for by a volunteer until they reached a good weight, and then released into two wonderful gardens in Roos.
