## Woodland Group ROOS



The Group are delighted to have been awarded two grants from the Roos Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund. One grant will complete the renovation of the footpath 5 hedgerow by reducing the height of the larger shrubs at the east end of the footpath this Autumn. This will make the hedge a more manageable size so the Group can maintain it in the future. In addition we will be planting a new Yew hedgerow for Tunstall church and more spring bulbs around Roos and Hilston. Should you have a frontage that is suitable for early crocus and narcissus and would like some to plant please email Heather: [hefkelly@hotmail.com](mailto:hefkelly@hotmail.com). We only have a limited amount so it will be first come first served with planting taking place from August.

Our second grant is in partnership with the Roos Parochial Church Council and will review the trees in the churchyard and wood to the north of the church to produce a management plan for the future. Work has already commenced with an initial survey being carried out by a qualified arborist. Some rudimentary clearing work will be carried out by the Woodland Group this summer. We will post a message on the Roos Village Amenities and Roos Woodland Group Facebook pages when this work is planned and would welcome volunteers to help out.

We will be apple picking again this Autumn so any surplus apples and help picking them will be greatly appreciated. – Watch this space.

## Letters to the Editor

**The Parish Council and the Village stood united at an emergency meeting held on Monday evening, July 16th, against the future development of land, north of Eastfield House, Pilmar Lane, Roos.**

ERYC Planning Department had previously authorised the applicant Mr David Grayson to build houses on the land, he has however since changed this application and is looking for authorisation for 'the siting of 18 static caravans for residential park home occupation'.

Attendees were given an opportunity to talk and to voice their opinions and concerns which were numerous and varied, it became apparent that the main opposition was the fact that the application has changed from houses to caravans. It was felt unanimously that caravans were inappropriate for the Village and did not meet our community housing ethos of local homes for local people.

It was agreed that a 'door knocking exercise' would be undertaken to circulate a petition for submission to the Planning Department, running alongside in support of this it was highly encouraged for all who opposed to either write or comment online personally. The importance of personal opinions in matters such as this cannot be stressed enough.

There will, in addition to the above, be an opportunity for a village representative to address the Committee reiterating our concerns as a community.

The date for the Planning Committee to meet in Beverley and agree their decision is yet to be confirmed, it will however be published by the Parish Council in as timely manner as possible in the hope that we can attend en-masse, standing together once again ensuring there is no mistaking our stance.

The Parish Council would like to thank those who attended the meeting and for the community's efforts so far.

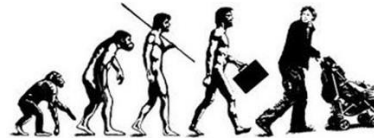

## Roos Parish Council Report: June 2018

The following is a condensed version of the recently confirmed Minutes for June 2018

### Roos Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund

It was agreed that the Clerk sign the Terms of Agreement for the grant of £7,500.00 in respect of the Community Needs Assessment.

It was also agreed to discuss with the consultant the possibility of linking the subject of Local Homes for Local People with the Community Needs Assessment and to invite her to a meeting in September to discuss moving forward the community exercise.

### Planning

- Construction of a lined slurry lagoon at land south west of Longborough Lane Owstwick - 18/01481/PLF. It was agreed that no objections be made to the application.
- Change of use from store at first floor to residential flat and installation of external stairs at buildings south west of Melbourne Butchers Main St Roos - 18/01599/PLF. It was agreed that no objections be made to the application but to highlight the issue of parking problems on Main Street.

### Public session

Mrs Kerr-Delworth enquired if a footpath could be provided on Rectory Road between Hodgson Lane and Pinfold Lane which would complete a circular footpath walk of Roos. She was advised that ERYC was approached a few years ago and that it was considered that providing one was too expensive but that nevertheless the Council would once again approach ERYC about provision of a new footpath on that particular stretch of road and to enquire if ERYC could source funding towards its cost.

### Next meeting

The next meeting to be held in the Memorial Institute on **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> August 2018** commencing at 7.30pm unless otherwise advised.
