Robert Walker, Seth Thompson, Ben Richardson and Tom Graham are all 10 and are doing Humberside Police - Lifestyle 2018 project. They are called 'Phenomenal 4' and their goal is to raise awareness and spread the word about children's mental health.

The boys are promoting good mental health in children with their idea #friendshipwins. This idea originated because the boys are all competitive football players but discussed that although winning is great, being friends is better. They believe that good Mental health in children is made with the friendships built partaking in community and team groups such as football/rugby and other team activities. Being a supported and valued team member is one step to being mentally healthy.

They are also raising funds for Roos Church, where all the boys partake in bell ringing as a team and build friendships with young and older people alike. They have done a coffee morning, sold sweets at the school and a stall at the Withernsea carnival. They have also designed a wristband to help spread this message and our mission over the next three weeks is to see how many people we can get to wear our bands around Hull and Holderness to spread the #friendshipwins message. Bands are available in adult and children sizes from any of the team members

This community spirit has also shone through as the boys were contacted through social media by Ben Maltas who has designed and made them a friendship bench which they are hoping to get installed at the school. The idea behind the bench is that if a child is feeling a bit lonely and looking for a friend to talk to or play with they make their way to the bench and take a seat. The rules of the Bench are simple for children - if they see someone sitting on the bench, they approach them and ask if they want to play. #friendshipwins

Farmyard Bingo Roos




A big thank you to everyone who came to bingo in August and made it a tremendous evening and also to Steve at Propa Butchers for supplying the delicious and varied meat.

All Saints' Church Roos Plans Update and Fundraising

Roos Church is a Grade 1 Listed Building which means that any proposals to change the interior or exterior are subjected to detailed scrutiny by Historic England and the Diocese of York. Other bodies such as the Victorian Society are also included in the consultation process.

Our architect has drawn up the plans for the installation of the disabled access toilet, a kitchenette, the extension of the ringing gallery and the creation of some flexible, usable space. These plans have been on display in the church for the last few months. A lot of work has been going on behind the scenes to ensure that these plans are sympathetic to the beautiful character of our church, but at the same time ensure the viability and sustainability of the building.

We are all too aware that St. Nicholas Church in Withernsea has been closed. It had no facilities and the maintenance costs grew too great for the limited amount of use it could have. The Roos PCC are determined that our church will stay open to serve our community but it really is a case of 'use it, or lose it'.

Therefore our church needs to evolve – just as it has done through the centuries, to meet changing needs.

We are delighted to report that our plans have been approved in full and we are now in a position to apply for grant funding to supplement our fundraising..

How much do we need? Our budget figure is £165,000. This may seem like a huge amount but it is not simply a case of installing a toilet etc. Each element of the plans has a knock on effect on the next, so it isn't possible to tackle any item in isolation without making even more work and thereby increasing the total cost. A lot of craftsmanship will be involved.

Our successful projects to restore and augment the bells and the major restoration of the pipe organ have been widely acclaimed and will stand us in good stead for funding applications, but local fund raising is vitally important too.

Roos Parish Council Report: July 2018

Parish Council Minutes are published in full on Parish Notice Boards and on the parish website – roosparish.info The following is a condensed version of the recently confirmed Minutes for July 2018

Highway issues

A further reply from ERYC confirmed that following a site visit to the Eastfield Estate the extra parking markings would be ordered together with some give way lines that require refreshing.

Proposed footpath on Rectory Road

A reply from Mr Alderson of ERYC indicated that he had previously advised the Council that through maintenance funds it would not be possible to justify the installation of a new footway along Rectory Road. Claire Watts of the ERYC's external funding team may be able to provide further assistance.

Planning

Change of use of land for the siting of static caravans for residential park home occupation and operational development consisting of the construction of an access road, parking and foul and surface water drainage infrastructure at land north of Eastfield House Pilmar Lane Roos - 18/01920/PLF. It was agreed to strongly object to the application as it would be totally alien to the fabric and character of the village with caravans proposed to replace the previous application for traditional brick built properties which would allow for an element of affordable housing.

It was agreed that an open public meeting be held on the 16th July at 7pm and that the Holderness Gazette be made aware of the situation.

It was reported that ERYC had approved the following four applications.

- Alterations and extensions including erection of two storey extension to rear and porch to front and construction of detached double garage with store at 1 Hilltop Cottages Quaker Road Owstwick
- Erection of porch to front and single storey extension to rear at 6 Cherry Hill Park Roos
- Erection of single storey extension to rear at Elm Lodge Elm Garth Roos
- Erection of single storey infill extension at Ivy House Rectory Road Roos

Treasurer's report The Treasurer sought and received approval for payment of the following accounts:-

- MPH Accountancy annual audit fee £84.00
- B Lee salary/expenses for three months £962.50

Any other business

Footpath works - Cllr Tyson referred to proposed resurfacing of Pilmar Lane footpath. It was agreed to seek further information.

Speeding vehicles in Pilmar Lane - Cllr Devanney reported that this was still an ongoing issue. It was agreed to refer the matter once again to ERYC to provide speed checks and to invite PC Ainley to a future meeting with the Council.

Public session

Rectory Road footpath. Mrs Kerr-Delworth commented that Mark Jessop of ERYC had acknowledged the request for a new footpath on Rectory Road between Hodgson Lane and Pinfold Lane and that Sport England could possibly provide funding towards its provision from it Community Asset Fund.
