

Parish Council Meeting June 2015

Parish Council Minutes are published in full on Parish Notice Boards and on the parish website - roosparish.info

All Councillors were in attendance, however, there were no members of the public present.

Under Matters Arising it was noted that:

Roos Wind Farm Community Fund.

The panel made the following awards at its meeting held on 26th May:

Details of the purpose of the funding are not presently known.

Tedder Hill Wind Farm Community Fund.

The awarding panel met on 3rd June, the outcome of this meeting will be reported in next month's issue.

Speeding traffic - Rectory Road.

It was believed that this would not be a policing matter, but one for the ERYC to consider. If they deemed it appropriate, a speed measuring system could be placed across the highway to establish the extent of the issue. It was noted that this was an issue of concern at other locations in and around the village.

Planning Applications:

- Erection of two storey extension to existing outbuildings at The Chestnuts Rectory Road Roos
 15/01412/PLF. It was noted that the ERYC had received some letters of concern from local residents. It was
 agreed to request the ERYC to take these concerns into account and in the event of planning approval
 being granted to consider attaching appropriate Conditions.
- Continued use of land and buildings as livery stables for the keeping and grazing of horses at Willow Toft Farm Owstwick Road Danthorpe – 15/01469/PLF No objection
- Erection of detached garage at Mayfield Farm Tower Road Hilston -15/01547/PLF No objection.

The Council received notification that the Planning Application for the erection of 4 dwellings at The Paddock, South End, Roos had been withdrawn.
