Minutes of the Roos Parish Council meeting held in the Memorial Institute Roos on Monday 14th February 2022

Present: Cllrs D Winter (Chair), B Nisbet, T Cook and A Dodson.

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs W Ainley, M Maltas and K Tyson.

1. Consideration of Councillor's declaration of interests

There were no changes declared by members to the register of interests.

2. Minutes of the meeting held on 13th December 2021

These were agreed as a true record and signed by the Chair.

Matters arising from the minutes

3. Emergency Plan

Members noted the comments of Cllr Ainley to the updated plan and the Chair confirmed that the plan would be forwarded to ERYC for its records.

4. Lamb Lane/South End road junction

It was reported that ERYC had now marked up the area for the proposed kerbing improvement works at the junction.

5. Roos Beck

It was reported that the minor issue of debris in the vicinity of the church which was not affecting the free flow of water had now been attended to and that further upstream maintenance works near the school in Main street had been undertaken Stephensons and that it was understood that further culvert work in conjunction with ERYC was under consideration.

6. Longbrough Lane byway

The Clerk reported a reply from ERYC which stated that the lane is on the East Riding's highway maintenance maps and as such it is considered to be a public highway maintainable at public expense and a further reply stated that arrangements would be made to clear the overgrown sections of the lane which were of concern.

Correspondence

The Clerk reported that he had previously circulated to members the Government devolution proposals, ERSAB newsletter, Emergency Planning, Town & Parish Council Charter and Holderness Health patient flow chart and it was agreed to adopt the said Charter.

A communication was received from ERYC which stated that the developers of the land east and west of The Paddock in South End had suggested Meadow Croft for the street naming as one of the residents of the new property has a speech impediment and would have difficulties pronouncing Wilbraham which the Council had previously put forward for any future development and it was agreed to accept the proposed name.

Planning

Change of use of security office to dwelling at Oldschooler Ltd Kilum Hall Hilston Road Roos – 22/00231/PLF

It was agreed to object to the application as the the proposed development is outside the development limit of the village in what is classed as open countryside.

7. Treasurer's report

The Treasurer sought and received approval for payment of the following account:-

8. HM Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

The Chair and Cllr Cook reported that the village had set up a committee to consider and coordinate possible events to celebrate the occasion and a request from Roos School was received for the Council to consider providing a token of memorabilia for the school children.

It was agreed to provide mugs as in previous jubilee celebrations from possible funding from a limited ERYC Jubilee Fund which the Clerk had already applied to and for which a decision was awaited.

It was also agreed that the monies to be received from the Tedder Hill Windfarm Fund, the Roos Windfarm Fund and the Burton Pidsea Windfarm Fund totalling £3,750.00 be allocated to the committee for the purposes of funding the celebrations.

Any other business

9. Notice board

Cllr Dodson confirmed that he would shortly be painting the notice board following the repair works carried out by Cllr Tyson.

10. Litter picking group

The Chair reported that Caroline Hare had set up a litter picking group and that ERYC had provided necessary equipment on loan, further that initial litter tidy up activity had already taken place in Roos and that ERYC had collected the contents in the waste bags.

It was agreed that this be an agenda item for the next meeting to consider possible dates for the session.
